Microsoft Software Enterprise Agreement	Council

Purpose and background

- 1. The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval to enter into a contract with Data #3 Ltd (Data #3) for the maintenance of Microsoft software licences (Contract) and an associated Enterprise Agreement (Agreement) with Microsoft Australia (Microsoft) for a contract term of three years.
- 2. Data #3 is a Licenced Service Provider for Microsoft under the Whole of Victorian Government contract, which was awarded by the Department of Premier and Cabinet in June 2016 following a public tendering process.
- 3. The purchase of the software licences via Data #3 also involves Council entering into the Agreement with Microsoft for the use of the software over the contract period. There is no additional cost to Council in respect to the Agreement.
- 4. The payment to Data #3 on Microsoft products provides Council with the right to use and upgrade to the latest version of any purchased product covered under the Agreement over the Contract term.
- 5. In June 2017, Council renewed its contract for maintenance of Microsoft software licences for a period of three years accessing a previous State Government contract for an amount of \$2.102 million over the term. This contract will expire on 31 May 2020.
- 6. The new State contract supports the transition of traditional computing technologies to 'cloud' based services and enables Council to access discounted pricing via the State.

Key issues

- 7. City of Melbourne is able to access competitive pricing via a new contract with Data #3 on the terms set in the new State Government contract given the negotiated economies of scale.
- 8. The proposed Council contract covers the maintenance and subscription of Microsoft software licences across all of Council's IT infrastructure systems and provides access by the Council to 'cloud' based technology.
- 9. The cost of the Contract will not exceed \$2.85 million over three years. Annual payments will be made over the life of the contract. Subsequent variations may occur based on volume alone (e.g. new staff, new facilities or new devices). City of Melbourne's 2020–21 Annual Plan and Budget includes provision to meet the first year Contract costs.

Recommendation from management

- 10. That Council approves entry into:
 - 10.1. A contract with Data #3 Ltd to acquire Microsoft software licences for a period of three years commencing from 1 June 2020 under the terms contained in the State Government contract for a cost not to exceed \$2.85 million over the term.
 - 10.2. An associated Enterprise Agreement with Microsoft Australia at no additional cost.

Legal

1. Pursuant to section 186 of the *Local Government Act 1989* (the Act), before a Council enters into a contract for the purchase of goods or services to the value of \$150,000 or more (levels increased by Order in Council dated 7 August 2008), the Council must give public notice of the purpose of the contract and invite tenders from persons wishing to undertake the contract.

In the present case, a tender was not required as on 4 September 2009 the then Minister for Local Government granted an exemption under section 186(5) of the Act from the tendering obligations where the Council wishes to access the goods or services via a whole of government contract.

Finance

2. The draft 2020–21 Annual Plan and Budget includes a provision for Microsoft licences which is sufficient to meet the first year contract costs.

Conflict of interest

3. No member of Council staff, or other person engaged under a contract, involved in advising on or preparing this report has declared a direct or indirect interest in relation to the matter of the report.

Health and Safety

4. In developing this proposal, no Health and Safety issues or opportunities have been identified.

Stakeholder consultation

5. Consultation has been undertaken with the proposed service provider and analysis undertaken of the State Government contract.

Relation to Council policy

- 6. Leveraging the State Government contract allows Council to take advantage of negotiated economies of scale and aligns to Council's goal of managing resources well.
- 7. Procurement of this software has been conducted in accordance with the Councils' Procurement Policy.

Environmental sustainability

- 8. Microsoft has been operating in a carbon neutral fashion since 2012 and has a stated commitment to being carbon negative by 2030 with the target that by 2050, the company will have removed all directly emitted carbon since it was founded in 1975.
- 9. Data centres operated by Microsoft are powered by 60 per cent renewable energy with a target of 70 per cent by the 2023.
- 10. The company also has a target of replenishing all water consumed in water-stressed regions by 2030.
- 11. Estimates show that cloud computing providers such as Microsoft will have achieved a 38 per cent reduction in worldwide data centre energy expenditure by 2020, in comparison to organisations operating their own data centres.
