Structure of Future Melbourne Committee and leadership roles for Councillors

Purpose and background

- 1. The purpose of this report is to enable Council to:
 - 1.1. determine the membership and role of the Future Melbourne Committee (the Committee)
 - 1.2. establish leadership roles for Councillors as Portfolio Leads and Deputy Leads.
- 2. At the beginning of each term, the Council undertakes a review of governance arrangements to support decision-making and city representation roles including matters relating to the operation of the Committee.

Key issues

- 3. Councillors have undertaken a review of the Committee structure and associated roles with a view to implementing an arrangement which gives Council the decision-making framework for the next four years.
- 4. Under a proposed new arrangement, the agenda for Committee meetings will not be structured in portfolio segments as featured during the previous term.
- 5. Instead, it is proposed that the Committee continue with a membership comprising all Councillors and that the Lord Mayor and Deputy Lord Mayor act as Committee Chair and Deputy Chair respectively. It is also proposed that the Deputy Lord Mayor assume the role of Chair when the Committee considers planning matters where Council is the responsible authority, referral authority or planning authority.
- 6. The proposed arrangement seeks to provide for a more streamlined and efficient conduct of Committee business.
- 7. All Councillors will continue to hold leadership roles in designated areas of priority action for Council. It is proposed that this be achieved through the appointment of Councillors as Portfolio Leads and Deputy Leads overseeing a range of designated areas of responsibility. Through these roles, Councillors will facilitate the decision-making and city representation functions of Council.
- 8. Included as Attachment 2 is a schedule of proposed appointments as Portfolio Lead and Deputy Lead and associated areas of portfolio responsibility.

Recommendation from management

- 9. That Council:
 - 9.1. Resolves to continue the Future Melbourne Committee (the Committee) as a delegated committee of Council under section 63 of the *Local Government Act 2020* (LGA 2020).
 - 9.2. Appoints:
 - 9.2.1. All Councillors as members of the Committee.
 - 9.2.2. Subject to paragraph 9.2.3 below, the Lord Mayor as Chair and Deputy Lord Mayor as Deputy Chair of the Committee.
 - 9.2.3. The Lead of the Planning Portfolio as Chair, and the Deputy Lead of the Planning Portfolio as Deputy Chair, when the Committee considers planning matters where the Council is the responsible authority, referral authority or planning authority under the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*.

- 9.3. Notes that in the absence of the Chair and Deputy Chair, the Committee will appoint an Acting Chair.
- 9.4. By instrument of delegation sealed by the Council pursuant to section 11(1) of the LGA 2020 delegates to the members of the Committee, Council's powers, duties and functions pursuant to the LGA 2020 and any other Act subject to the restrictions contained in section 11(2) of the LGA 2020.
- 9.5. Revokes instrument of delegation CCL-2020-5 to the members of the Committee, such revocation to take effect immediately after the execution of the instrument of delegation referred to in paragraph 9.4 above.
- 9.6. Appoints Councillors to positions of Portfolio Lead and Deputy Lead and endorses the associated areas of portfolio responsibility as described in the schedule included as Attachment 2 to the management report.
